#### 6+ Months Before

Optional: Hire a Wedding Coordinator - If you decide to hire a
wedding coordinator, they will help you plan many details that are
listed on this checklist. If you can afford it - a good wedding
coordinator is very worthwhile.
Set Date - Is there a date that is particularly meaningful to you or a
season you prefer? It is good to make a list of dates you have in mind
before visiting venues.
<b>Set Budget -</b> This is a great time to decide who will pay for what.
Remember what's important to you and adjust accordingly.
Research and Visit Venues - Some venues can be difficult to secure
so you may need to be flexible on your date if you have a specific
venue in mind.
Find Officiant - It is important to find a professional that can help
you create a ceremony that is meaningful and specialized for you and
your partner.
Decide on Guest Count and List - Your guest count can be limited
due to venue restrictions or even preference so deciding whom you
want to be there is so important.
Select Your Wedding Party - If you want to have a maid of honor,
bridesmaids, best man, a friend of honor, etc, this is a good time to
decide who these people will be and ask them to be a part of your day.
<b>Shop for Rings</b> - This is a wonderful time to decide on what types of
rings you might want to symbolize your commitment. There are many
options from traditional bands to tattoos.

#### 6+ Months Before Find Photographer/Videographer - If professional photos and/or videos are important to you, reach out to them for availability and prices. of all the additional costs for a wedding - photographs are among the most important - to have for a lifetime and generations to come. **Optional: Save the Dates -** If your wedding is 6 months or longer away, you might consider sending digital or mailed "Save the Dates" to guests so they can plan. This is especially helpful for destination weddings where guests may need to travel. **Find a Florist -** Many couples choose to hire a florist for fresh flowers for the event. This is a great time to book if you plan to go that route. Alternatives are picking up flowers at a local market or order in bulk online and putting them together yourself before the ceremony. **Decide on Attire -** Will you buy a traditional wedding dress, rent a tux or buy a nice suit you can wear later and a dress you love off the rack. There are many options! Compile a List of Vendors: Finalize Contracts - Any vendors you plan to use for your wedding need to be contracted at this time. (This may include paying initial deposits) **Optional: Find and Purchase Your Dress/Attire** - If you plan to use a more traditional bridal shop, you will want to find your dress and

get it ordered as many have extensive lead times.

#### 4-5 Months Before

Optional: Open a Registry - Many couples opt to create a registry at a
local department store, online (like Amazon) or even a site like
Honeyfund to cover honeymoon expenses.
Book Entertainment - Do you want to have live music, DJ or similar
at your wedding. Make sure to get them booked asap.
Shop and Order Wedding Cake/Dessert - This is a great time to
decide on if you want a traditional wedding cake and vendor or if you
prefer a less traditional option like pies, cookies, donuts, etcthe
options are endless.
Determine Reception Menu - Earlier you decided on who was going
to prepare food for your wedding, now you must determine what will
be on the menu. This is the fun part!
Wedding Favors/Charitable Donations - Do you want to give your
wedding attendees a special token to remember your day? Another
option is to donate to a charity and create a small card to share with
guests.
Optional: Reserve room blocks - If many of your guests are traveling
from out of town, you can negotiate a special rate with a local hotel
and reserve a block of rooms that guests can call and book.
Start Planning Your Honeymoon - Decide on a budget, where you
will go, how long you will go, etc, and make reservations for lodging,
etc.
Collect Addresses from Guests - Collect addresses for physical
invitations or email addresses if you plan to send invites digitally
instead.

# 4-5 Months Before Optional: Book Lodging for Your Wedding Night - Some couples prefer to spend their wedding night at home and some prefer a hotel, cabin or even Bed & Breakfast for their wedding night. Research and Order Invitations - You must choose if you want to send paper invitations or explore other options like digital invites. If you plan to order invitations, now is the time to do this. Pick out/Purchase outfit accessories - Decide on shoes, veil, jewelry, accessories you will wear on your big day. Wear the shoes around the house in advance and break them in! You don't want to be uncomfortable on your wedding day. Optional: Pick out Attire for Groomsman - Whether you would like your groomsmen to wear suits or even coordinating outfits, you will need to let them know what you wish for them to wear on your big day. #### 2-3 Months Before

Optional: Book a Hairstylist/Makeup Artist - If you wish to have
someone else do your hair and/or makeup on your wedding day, you
will want to get your appointment scheduled. Many brides opt to do
their own hair and makeup or have a friend help instead.
<b>Send Invitations -</b> Whether you are mailing invitations or sending
digital invites, now is the time to send those out.
Optional: Plan Rehearsal Dinner - Traditionally couples host a
dinner with the bridal party, parents and officiant the day/evening
before the wedding. This is an opportunity to spend time with a
smaller group and walk through the details of the day ahead.
Optional: Make a Reception Playlist - If you plan to have live music
DJ or even a playlist on some speakers, you may want to create a list
of songs you would like played at the reception.
Pick out any Music for the Ceremony - Should you want music
played or sung at the ceremony, this is a great time to decide on this.
We recommend involving your officiant in planning ceremony
details.
Plan the Order of the Ceremony - Your officiant will likely have
great advice on this. You can work with them to plan a memorable
and special ceremony that you both will enjoy.
Plan Your Vows - Meet with your officiant to discuss if you will use
traditional vows, alternate options or write your own entirely. They
will likely be able to provide you with much insight and options.

haven't forgotten anything and confirm, confirm, confirm

Get a Manicure and Pedicure - Enjoy a little pampering and get those
hands and feet wedding-ready.
Treat Yourself to a Massage - This is a great way to enjoy some
relaxation and de-stress before the wedding
